SERA2010 Call for Workshop / Special Session Proposals

SERA 2010 organization committee invites proposals for the SERA2010 Special Sessions / Workshops Program. Special sessions and co-located workshops at SERA 2010 conference will become an important meeting point for researchers willing to discuss and exchange ideas on advance research topics related to the Software Engineering.

General Information

- Special sessions / workshops must be on topics that are of interest to SERA attendees.
- Special session / Workshop duration can be half a day or a full day.
- We strongly advise having more than one organizer, preferably from different institutions, bringing different perspectives to the workshop topic.
- We welcome Special sessions / Workshops with creative structures and organizations that attract various types of contributions and ensure rich interactions.
- The papers submitted to a special session/workshop will be reviewed by the SERA PC and published in the SERA 2010 proceedings. A special session/workshop organizer is normally given the authority to select a certain number of papers based on the review results. The organizer plays a role of a small conference program chair so the Program chairs do not interfere with the selection process.

Important Dates

- Workshop proposals are due on December 15. Proposals should be sent to sera2010-priv@encs.concordia.ca
- Notification of acceptance/rejection will be given by December 28, 2009.

Submitting a proposal

Proposals should be no more than 2 pages in length, text or PDF format and should contain the following information:

- The title and brief technical description of the special session / workshop, specifying its goals and motivation.
- A brief discussion of why the topic is of particular interest at this time.
- A brief description of why and to whom the special session / workshop is of interest, the audience, as well as the expected number of participants.
- A brief description of the proposed special session / workshop format, discussing the mix of events such as paper presentations, invited talks, panels, and general discussion.
- An indication of whether the special session / workshop should be considered for a half-day or full-day meeting.
- The names and contact information (web page, email address) of the proposed organizers.
