- International students must have all their papers and be in Montreal prior to the beginning of the Summer 1 term.
- Full-time is defined as taking at least 9 credits. All INDU courses are 4 credits, except for INDU 6990 which is 8 credits.
- The 1 elective course mentioned in Year 2 of Options II-V must be selected from list <u>E12</u>, <u>E01</u>, or <u>MECH</u> courses
- Many MECH courses are reserved for MECH and AERO students and are not available for INDU students. Always select electives that are available to INDU students.
- Note that there is no course sequence for <u>I Engineering Management</u> as that requires students to have a full-time engineering job at a local company to do their two <u>industrial stages</u>, as required by the program. It is also the nature of the option that we can accept only very few students. International students are thus not accepted for the Engineering Management option.
